The Pacific Music Festival debuts in China

The Pacific Music Festival and primary founding sponsor Nomura have supported the development of young musicians from around the world for 22 years

Beijing, August 3, 2012—The Pacific Music Festival (PMF), a series of international music and education events supported by primary founding sponsor Nomura, is staging orchestral concerts on August 2 in Shenyang and on August 4 in Beijing.

The concerts, the first by the PMF Orchestra outside Japan, are part of the celebrations for the 40th anniversary of the normalization of diplomatic relations between China and Japan.
