

2013 Grants Update



Greenhouse

Impacts 2,200 young people

- Greenhouse empowers young people in London's most disadvantaged communities to realise their potential through intensive sport and dance programmes delivered by inspirational coaches
- Greenhouse was awarded a grant of £56,000 over one year to fund their table-tennis academy at Morpeth School in East London. The programme focuses on developing young people's engagement with their education and community whilst improving their health and wellbeing



East London Business Alliance (ELBA)

Impacts 600 young people

- ELBA aims to create possibilities and opportunities in East London by connecting businesses to local people, public and community partners to enable social, economic and infrastructure change
- ELBA was awarded a grant of £35,000 to fund the Beyond Boundary project to support a community regeneration project in the Boundary Estate in Bishopsgate over one year



IntoUniversity

Impacts 150 young people

- IntoUniversity provides a national network of high quality, local learning centres where young people facing challenges are inspired to achieve. Each local centre offers an innovative programme of academic support and mentoring in order to raise young people's aspirations and improve their life chances
- IntoUniversity was awarded a grant of £30,000 to fund the running costs of a career and further education centre to support 500 young people over one year



ThinkForward

Impacts 500 young people

- ThinkForward aims to reduce the number of young people not in education, employment or training (NEET) so they can reach their full potential
- ThinkForward was awarded a grant of £100,000 to fund a coach at Oaklands Secondary School over two years. The coach will identify at-risk 14 year olds and provide them with targeted support to ensure that they transition successfully into work, education or training



Shakespeare's Globe

Impacts 70 young people

- Shakespeare's Globe aims to promote, maintain and advance education by encouraging and stimulating public appreciation and understanding of the dramatic art in all its forms, principally in relation to the performance of the works of William Shakespeare
- Shakespeare's Globe was awarded a grant of £38,000 to fund an early years transition project in five primary schools in Southwark over two years



The Young Vic

Impacts 20 young people

- The Young Vic is a theatre whose mission is to provide opportunities and access for artists and audiences of all ages, back grounds and walks of life. They create innovative and challenging theatre of the highest quality and social impact
- The Young Vic was awarded a grant of £22,000 over one year to fund 'A Season in the Congo' Parallel Production, providing cultural enrichment opportunities to up to 20 disadvantaged young people in Lambeth and Southwark



Kids Company

Impacts 40 young people

- Kids Company provides a safe and secure environment for children and young people experiencing, or at risk of neglect, abuse and trauma. They provide assistance to over 14,000 vulnerable children and young people living in the most deprived areas of London
- Kids Company has been awarded a grant of £110,000 over two years to fund the continued provision of key workers at their Kenbury Works Centre. The key workers will continue working with the young people with whom they are engaged with to ensure continuity, an essential part of fostering positive attachments, so often lacking from the young people's lives

Young Enterprise (YEL)

Impacts 800 young people



- YEL inspires and prepares young people to succeed in a global economy. Their programmes provide young people with the opportunity to gain personal experiences of how business works, understand the role it plays in providing employment and creating prosperity and be inspired to improve their own prospects
- YEL has been awarded a renewal grant of £40,000 over one year in order for the Trust to continue as the principal funder of the 'Investment Banks in Action' (IBIA) programme. IBIA teaches students key concepts about the banking industry. Participants develop their social skills and financial literacy as well as being introduced to positive role models through business volunteers

The Brokerage Citylink

Impacts 800 young people



- The Brokerage aims to raise the aspirations and awareness of young people attending state schools to the careers and opportunities available within the financial and business service sectors
- The Brokerage has been awarded a renewal grant of £35,000 over two years to continue to fund 'Introduction to Working Life'; an employability programme helping to raise the aspirations of primary school students in Southwark, utilising our partnership with Southwark Park Primary School

Oaklands Secondary School

Impacts 600 young people



- Oaklands is a small secondary school in Tower Hamlets with 600 students and 47 teaching staff. Situated in one of the most deprived parts of the UK, at the last Ofsted inspection the school was graded as outstanding and is designated as a High Performing Specialist School
- Oaklands Secondary School was awarded a renewal grant of £40,000 to continue to enrich the curriculum and provide study support, extracurricular activities and the opportunity to enhance the international dimension of the school

School-Home Support

Impacts 160 young people



- School-Home Support (SHS) works on the simple ethos of getting every child in school and ready to learn, whatever it takes. Dedicated SHS practitioners offer a combination of specialist support, emotional and practical advice to vulnerable children and young people
- School-Home Support were awarded a renewal grant of £80,000 over two years to fund the provision of two practitioners in two Southwark primary schools
